^{xi} Exceptional circumstances may be defined as a demonstrated change in circumstances, which can be shown on the ability to train at that time and may include severe personal illness or family caring responsibility incompatible with continuing to train. Applicants will only be considered if they provide a 'support for reapplication to a specialty training programme' form signed by both the Training Programme Director / Head of School and the Postgraduate Dean in the LETB / Deanery that the training took place. No other evidence will be accepted.

^{xii} The MRCPCH examination format changed in February 2013. After this date for those entering at ST2 it will be desirable to hold any two of the three written MRCPCH papers (Applicants will usually be expected to have obtained Foundation of Practice plus one other paper)
